Electrician is a good job because of the great pay you get, an average of \$92,658.


You also get to work in different environments, and you can also do commercial and domestic.

Commercial Electricians.


Construction Electricians.

#### My experience in the workplace - Ty

My experience in the work place has been short but great. At the start of last year, I had a football incident on round 4 in the first 15 seconds of the game. Sadly, I had a very bad knee injury with my ACL, MCL, meniscus, 3 fractures and a calf tear. This injury stopped me from working until this moment on, but before the injury I had 5 weeks of work in the plumbing industry and it was definitely the industry I want to be in.

Plumbing is a very good job and area I want to be in. Even though I haven't worked in it for that long I still think that is offers very good skills in construction, social and many more. This job provides good pay and many more benefits like hazard money, injury money and more.

#### Task 2: Writing for Practical Purposes – Riley

With my experience in the electrical industry, I had tried two different areas; the domestic side of electrical which is houses and electrical fitting which is creating large size power boards for factories and other things. My first day for domestic wasn't bad, it was just following the people around and seeing what they were doing. The only negative about day one was having to walk around inside the roof. The second day was various jobs but one included installing an aerial on the roof and it started to rain mid job which made it hard. For the third, fourth and fifth days I was helping them rewire an entire house. For a beginner, twisting wires and fitting them into power points, switches and light bases is not an easy task. You often fail a lot. But for the most part I was under the house. They told me that the space we had under there was actually a lot, while in reality it was at most 1-1 ½ feet space under there. It is very hard to breathe in those conditions considering you are on your stomach the whole time. There is also a lot of dust that gets into your lungs. I did this during winter, but I was sweating profusely. It was very hot under there. I couldn't imagine what it was like in summer. I checked my phone later due to using it for the torch and I was under there for about 10 hours in total. I cannot imagine what doing that would be like in an even smaller enclosed space or even in summer. It would be way too hard to do. For my second experience in the electrical industry, I would go between two factories helping two groups of people. In the first factory I would help unbox the electrical powerboards and start to assemble them. This was very taxing on your feet as you were standing in one place for long periods of time. In the second factory I would mainly do small tasks that the others didn't want to so they delegated them to me such as cutting wires, measuring up steel and cutting it and other things. This also required you to stand in one place for extended periods of time which hurt my feet a lot. The factories had no cooling, there was only one tower fan in each factory which did not help much. By the end of the week I could barely stand. This was due to the large blisters that appeared on my feet that lasted for over a week.

I do not recommend this industry to people who aren't committed. This will be very physically taxing on you.

If it is a design, which can negatively affect your reputation as a tattoo artist, then you do not have to tattoo it.

A lot of your time spent as a tattoo artist will be designing, tracing and tattooing all different types of ideas. You will get to tattoo a large array of different styles ranging from realism, cartoons and lettering not only allowing you to practise and perfect your own skills and styles, but experiment with hundreds more. You will get clients who will give you almost complete free rein on what they are tattooed, therefore allowing you to design whatever you are comfortable and enjoy drawing. Overall being a tattoo artist is a very art-based career with so many different ways to express yourself creatively.

#### Positive experience:

There is not a better feeling then having a client come in with a design or sentimental piece they want to be done and you being the one to make it happen for them. Seeing a person's reactions to an important tattoo to them is such a heart-warming moment for both you and the client. Not only that but also being able to see a client enjoy some of your own work and designs is an amazing feeling, knowing that they respect, appreciate and enjoy your talents and hard work.
